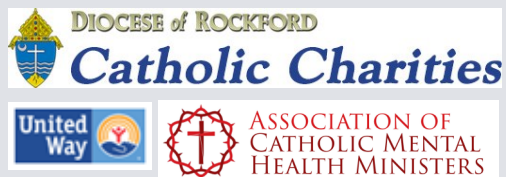

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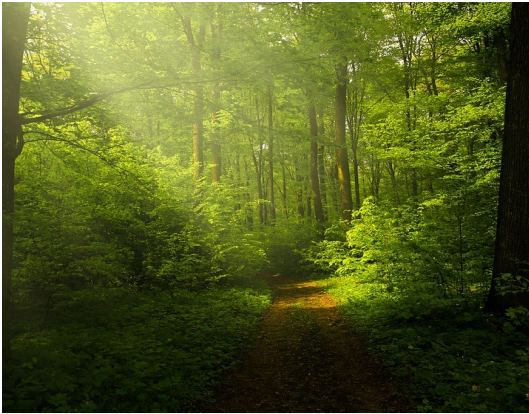

Are you called to serve in Mental Health Ministry?

A mental health minister serves as a prayerful companion for fellow parishioners experiencing mental health or substance abuse challenges. We primarily provide support through holy listening, that is, listening in the context of the healing presence of God.

We affirm one's dignity and value by letting their story unfold at their pace in a safe, confidential, welcoming environment. We provide spiritual companionship through prayer, referrals, guidance on the treatment process, education and respect for the individual.

We do not take on the roles of psychologists, psychiatrists or therapists. In providing a true human connection through Christian love we journey together toward a fuller Catholic faith life.

MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY

A mental health minister is rooted and living in the Catholic faith; committed to assisting those with mental health and substance abuse challenges. Do you have a heart for giving and a willingness to share God's love?

A mental health minister is:

- Compassionate
- A good listener
- Respectful of all
- Willing to learn
- Reliable

Mental health ministers:

- **Do NOT provide treatment**
- Prayerfully accompany parishioners and families in need
- Seek to understand and affirm
- Serve as members of a team
- Protect confidentiality
- Model self-care
- Listen without judgement
- Establish and maintain boundaries
- Acquire mental health literacy
- Complete Mental Health First Aid
- Maintain familiarity with local treatment resources
- Cultivate hope through awareness, acceptance and accompaniment
